As with all forces of nature, a firewalk contains the element of risk. HeatherAsh Amara has taught and led the ancient practice of firewalking for over twenty years. She teaches people the proper methods and safe handling of this powerful element. Following

her instructions, burns are very rare and never cause serious injury.
